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said. He said the five bills did it. Those five bills came from the Judiciary Committee which has half again as many bills as any other Committee in this Legislature. Well, I want to explain to you that's why we asked for three days because we knew when we came into this session we were going to have a great number of bills. We have been an extremely busy committee in the interim and we purposely held back the introduction of these bills to give time to the bill drafter and everybody else to get through the 20 days. We did not intend to get those bills in before this time and these are the bills that you are now getting, Senator Syas, if you are listening. This is the reason and we still do not have before this Legislature the very extremely important bills on Correctional and Penal Reform which we are trying to get together with the various parties to make sure we have the correct amounts in the bills before we bring them before you, but we have plenty time to take care of them. I think the biggest problem is getting on General File everyday, Senator Syas. If we'd do that we would get our work done.

SPEAKER: The chair recognizes Senator Kennedy. We still have before us the motion to suspend the Rules for the rest of this day in order to introduce bills.

SENATOR KENNEDY: Mr. President, fellow members, just very briefly, we, too, in the Health and Welfare Committee have worked very seriously and many times overtime and we don't receive that overtime pay, but we have been trying to jell bills together that would be constructive when we bring them for introduction and we have been trying to, if we have bills that are duplications, we have been throwing them all into one bill. This takes considerable time. We've been waiting for information from Washington, D.C.. Again, we'll not get all the answers but we are trying to do the best we can. We will have some more bills and I hope that you will introduce them for us out of the Health and Welfare, so I am just trying to say, it's very important that we do it in a businesslike manner and not carelessly throw them in here. So, thank you.

SPEAKER: The chair recognizes Senator Proud.

SENATOR PROUD: Well, I am just going to request that Senator Syas asks unanimous consent to withdraw his motion, because we are just spinning our wheels here. It's ten ten and we, basically, haven't done anything, and we can go on and debate this for another hour if you want to do it, but I think Senator Syas will realize the silliness of doing that. I think you've made your point, Senator.

SPEAKER: Senator Syas.

SENATOR SYAS: Well, is there anyone that wants to...if you want to notify me right now. Is there anyone that wants to introduce a bill today? Do you want to introduce it? Go ahead. Introduce them. Well, if you are going to introduce them, otherwise, I am going to ask unanimous consent to withdraw the motion. Now, if you are going to introduce them...OK.

SPEAKER: We still have to vote on the motion to suspend the Rules yet, still because we've...(inaudible).

SENATOR SYAS: You see we've got to have our silly hour every morning, that some call it. So, this is part of it. I generally don't engage in it but today I am.

SPEAKER: We still have before us the motion until somebody does something about it.

SENATOR SYAS: If there is no one going to introduce the bill, I ask for unanimous consent to withdraw it. I got my point across, but I suppose tomorrow, Monday, we will have five or six more bills.
