SPEAKER: I don't have a worksheet. Sorry. Attention please, the general file consideration of L.B. 317.

CLERK: Legislative Bill 317, introduced by Senator Kelly of the 35th district. (bill read). There are amendments by Senator Luedtke's Judiciary Committee.

SPEAKER: Chair recognizes Senator Luedtke.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Mr. President and Members of the Legislature. I move adoption of the committee amendments to L.B. 317. Mr. President and Members of the Legislature, this bill deals with reporting to the Department of Motor Vehicles of the probation of any persons charged with violation of motor vehicle or traffic violations for purposes of central, some central agency containing this information. This has been something that has been lacking in our laws and is actually, hindered law enforcement officers across the State of Nebraska from actually, effectively enforcing our laws, our motor vehicle laws, in particular, traffic laws when it comes to assessing points and finding out who's on probation. Mr. Sullivan, the Director, appeared before the committee, John Sullivan, and he brought with him these amendments or one of the amendments which would provide that the director should not assess such a person with points when the person was placed on probation unless and until the director is advised by the court that such person previously placed on probation has either violated the terms of his probation and/or it has been revoked. Now this will take care of the problems and the fears involved in probation, and it satisfied the operation of our probation system in Lancaster County, in the Municipal Court of Lincoln with regarding our Assep program and Mr. Sullivan submitted this amendment and the committee adopted it and we would recommend that the Legislature adopt this amendment. While I'm talking about it, there is one other amendment which Senator Barnett put on the bill which further states, this is on page 3, line 1 after vehicles would insert "and the National Crime Information Center." This is a national, this makes the registration of these particular matters on the National Crime Information Center computer system so that it makes it all the easier to determine where and who is involved in these kind of cases.

SPEAKER: Any further discussion of the committee amendments? Senator Dickinson, do you wish to be heard on the amendments?

SENATOR DICKINSON: Well, I guess I have a question, Mr. Speaker, for Senator Luedtke, please.

SPEAKER: Senator Luedtke, will you yield to a question.

SENATOR DICKINSON: Is this, as I am glancing through this amendment hurriedly, is this saying that those convicted of drunken driving should still be on probation without having points removed from their driver's licenses?
