SPEAKER: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I would move the adoption of the...do you want a motion to reject the Committee amendment to take up the other one. Which way?

SPEAKER: That would be all right, yes.

SENATOR WARNER: The reason for the alternative amendment is identical to the Committee amendment with the exception that the word was Architectural...al..designating in the Committee amendment and it should have been Architecture...ure...instead of ural, and that is the only difference between the two amendments. So, if we can move to reject the Committee amendment, then I will speak to the alternate amendment, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: The motion before us now is to reject the Committee amendments. Is there further discussion of that motion to reject those. You are voting on the rejection. All those in favor of rejecting the Committee amendments, please say aye. Those opposed say no. So ordered. The Committee amendments are rejected. We are now down to the amendment in lieu of. Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I move the adoption of the amendment. What the amendment does is it changed the name in line 14 from Environmental Design to Architecture and Planning. Environmental Design was to be the Architectural College in some other related areas which I will let the introducer to explain, but those who appeared at the hearing felt that the word Environmental Design was not as indicative of the course of study as Architecture and Planning that could be. Then, the second part of the amendment strikes the language starting in line 15 through the balance of the... correction, line 16 through the balance of the new language. And that language permitted the Board of Regents upon their own motion by Resolution to establish such other Colleges as they would designate and we struck that portion from the bill so that it would require legislative action and the amendment of the statutes for the establishment of additional colleges.

SPEAKER: Is there any further discussion of that amendment? The question is shall the amendment be adopted. All those... Senator Whitney.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Will Senator Warner yield to a question?

SPEAKER: Will you yield.

SENATOR WARNER: Yes.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Is this amendment going to create any new colleges, the new programs, etc. or is it just changing names of old colleges?

SENATOR WARNER: The amendment, Senator Whitney, would, I guess essentially, does not create...it does not create new courses. It would separate the, for example, Architecture and Engineering are now together, as I understand it. They would be split. So it is a separate college, but, also, architecture is more broad in that it includes planning of...these are all courses presently taught but they would be tend to be placed under a single college compared to where they are now, as I understood it. Perhaps you should direct your question to the introducer if you want more detail, but I would be glad to answer it.

SENATOR WHITNEY: What would be the reason for wanting to split up a college into two colleges?
