date, and then the procedure takes place, the investigation goes on, you have your day in court, you get your license back, that is, unless it is revoked, then the court will pick it up, but this is in lieu of bail, bond technique which is used in many states and is very successful, and we'd like to have it as the first in a series of bills which will come up next year dealing with complete reform of bail bond. Then request 572, the last one, which is a housekeeping bill with regard to uniform commercial code which spells out where a collateral goods statement is to be filed. Namely where a mortgage on the real estate concerned would be filed of record. That is not now in the law and it is confusing as to where under the uniform commercial code these matters have to be filed, so this will merely clarify that.

SPEAKER: Is there any further discussion of the motion? The Chair recognizes Senator Proud.

SENATOR PROUD: I'm not objecting, at this time to the introduction of these bills, and these, Senator Luedtke are new bills for introduction is that what you are trying to do? But I try to establish some sort of a target date, like March 16th, when we hopefully finish our public hearings, which I don't think we are going to achieve, but I want to ask Senator Luedtke a question?

SPEAKER: Senator Luedtke will you yield?

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Yes.

SENATOR PROUD: It seems to me that your committee put in five bills the other day, now another batch, is this ever going to end?

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Now Senator Proud, I just answered the question when I started out my preliminary statement was that we didn't even have any hearing yesterday, we went into executive session for a whole period yesterday, we have handled all our bills and we have had about half again as many bills as any other committee. We have handled all our bills already and these five can be heard within your frame work, time schedule.

SENATOR PROUD: Well, then, just, to get back to my question that's fine. Is your committee contemplating introducing more bills?

SENATOR LUEDTKE: I also answered that. I said there will be two bills as far as I know to complete our correctional penal reform
