CLERK: March 14th.

SPEAKER: Senator Kennedy asking unanimous consent to bracket L.B. 206 until March 14th, are there objections? Any objections? Hearing none, it is so ordered, 206 is bracketed.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have one further communication from Congressman David Martin, House of Representatives under date of March 2nd, (read).

SPEAKER: Now, this is in response then, Senator Lewis, to L.R. 11.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: L.R. 11, right. Oh, I'm sorry, I thought that was mine, but I'll just hit on it anyway.

SPEAKER: Yeah. While you're on your feet--

SENATOR F. LEWIS: While I was here--just dropping by. I do think that that's unfair to this Legislature. I'm sure we're going to get the same response on mine so I'll say it now while I'm up, but I do think that people have to take into consideration the fact that there are tremendous impact on State funds right now. The revenue sharing thing is coming back upon us right now by this very same thing. They're going to cut out 50 to 70 to 80 categorical programs costing upwards of millions of bucks and then all those agencies are going to be running back here and this is already the first response to it.

SPEAKER: That was Senator Frank Lewis speaking on a point of personal privilege because there is nothing before the body. Now, then, do we have any other communications on the desk.

CLERK: None, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: Ladies and gentlemen, we're approaching soon here the point in our schedule where we go on to final reading. Senator Duis, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR DUIS: I'm very sorry, Mr. President, but Senator Syas just told me that he could not be at our Rules Committee meeting today and asked us to defer the hearing on his rules change to another date so we shall comply with his request and I would like to have the Clerk make note of this if he will, please.
