SPEAKER: All right. Now, we still have a motion before us, and that's the amended motion of Senator Fred Carstens. Senator Stahmer. I am looking for input at this time because I'm trying to come to a vote here and we are running out of time. Senator Stahmer.

SENATOR STAHMER: Mr. President, very quickly, in commenting on what Senator Carpenter said, if we lose a congressman here it will be picked up in an urban area of this country, rest assured, and if we can thank Nixon for cutting the farm support program, you can also thank him for this Supreme Court decision. It's his court and it's going to work against this part of the country, just as surely as the cutback in the farm subsidies has worked against this part of the country.

SPEAKER: Ok. We finally have it. There is a motion on the desk for the previous question. Does the chair see five hands. Thank you. The question is shall the debate now close. All those in favor will vote aye. All those opposed will vote no. The motion is to close debate. Your are voting to close debate on the issue. Have you all voted? The clerk will record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 2 nays, 20 not voting.

SPEAKER: Debate will now close. Who closes on the issue now. It was Senator Carstens motion that was amended but essentially it has become Senator Carpenter's motion. Senator Carstens, do you care to close on the motion? No closing. Senator Carpenter, do you waive closing on the motion. Thank you. The question is do you want to adopt the motion. Do you need the motion read again so you understand what it is.

CLERK: The motion reads as follows: Read.

SPEAKER: The question is shall the motion be adopted. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote no. Voting on the adoption of the amendment...amended motion, excuse me. Voting on the adoption of the amended motion to send Senator Syas and Senator Carstens to see the Attorney General. Have you all voted? Once again, the chair would ask if you have all voted? The clerk will record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 15 nays.

SPEAKER: The motion carries. Do we have any other business on the desk?

CLERK: Yes, Mr. President. Mr. President, the Education Committee notice--read. Mr. President, there are two Rule changes. One submitted by Senator Warner--read. Mr. President, there is another Rule change--read.

SPEAKER: Those all appear in the Journal.

CLERK: Mr. President, one Committee report--read. Mr. President, a new bill. Read title. LB 524. Mr. President, we have another motion to introduce a new bill. Read motion.

SPEAKER: We will lay that over unless you have the statement of intent on the desk. OK. He says lay it over.

CLERK: Lay it over?

SPEAKER: Yes.
