

Senator Cavanaugh. The previous question has been moved. Senator Proud do you--is there no one else that wants to--okay, I'll call the motion on the previous question. All those in favor of stopping debate vote aye. Those opposed nay. Senator Nore.

CLERK: Senator Luedtke voting aye. 41 ayes, no nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: Motion carries and Senator Proud, did you say you had any closing on your motion to amend? All right, we'll proceed then to the motion to amend then to a day certain, namely, a week from today at the head of general file. All those in favor will vote aye. Opposed will vote nay.

CLERK: Senator Lewis voting no.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Voting aye.

CLERK: Senator Luedtke voting aye.

SPEAKER: Has everybody voted? Record the vote. Record the vote.

CLERK: 24 ayes, 23 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: Motion carries. Only requires a majority of those voting. All right, now the--Senator Stahmer.

SENATOR STAHMER: Mr. President, does it require only majority vote, those voting when we are considering constitutional amendments?

SPEAKER: Well, this is just a motion, this is a motion as to putting a matter on general file. I don't think that has anything to do with it, as far as it being a constitutional amendment. It's just an amendment within the body. All right, now, Senator Barnett, what do you wish to do with your motion as amended?

SENATOR BARNETT: Mr. Chairman I, Mr. President and Members of the body at this time, I think I will withdraw my motion.

SPEAKER: You're asking for unanimous consent to do that? All right.

SENATOR BARNETT: I'll try it.

SPEAKER: All right. You're asking for unanimous consent. Senator Carpenter do you object?

SENATOR CARPENTER: A point of order. What's the position of the bill now after we just got through voting?

SENATOR BARNETT: Well right now, it's at the bottom of general file, L.R. 9 takes its place at the bottom of general file and now this motion would, as amended, this is before the House, would be to place it at the head of general file next Monday if the motion carries as amended.

SPEAKER: And Senator Barnett has now asked to withdraw, unanimous consent to withdraw the motion. Senator Proud, do you object?

SENATOR PROUD: Well, it seems to me we're again in a little procedural snarl. I amended his motion and I think the question has already been decided, just like a motion to adjourn.
