CLERK: Reading.

SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes Senator Cal Carstens.

SENATOR CARSTENS: Mr. President I move for the adoption of the amendments. Mr. Chairman this first amendment was brought to my attention by an owner and operator of a leased concession a piece of property and they are quite concerned, they had been granted this lease, they have put in a considerable amount of money into this leased property and they want to be assured that they're not going to be under this proposal, so they asked that we have an amendment be brought in to assure them that this would be done. This would not be a permit, would not be required, where there is a leased concession and they have to go over the road that would require it to get to this leased concession. They would be permitted to go into this concession without the permit, this is what this amendment does.

SPEAKER: Is there any further discussion of the Carstens amendment? Senator Fred Carsten did you wish to be heard on this particular amendment? Is there any further discussion of the amendment. The question is shall the amendment be adopted? Do you all understand it? All those in favor of the amendment say aye, excuse me Senator Burbach.

SENATOR BURBACH: Will he yield to a question?

SPEAKER: Will you yield Senator?

SENATOR CARSTENS: Yes.

SENATOR BURBACH: Senator Carstens I know you gave an explanation of it, but I don't believe I quite understood. An area where there is a concession where they are paying a percent of the profits from the game commission, two or five or eight percent or whatever the case may be, this particular area where a road leads to it would be exempt from the fee, but how far surrounding in the entire adjacent area, they're usually not fenced areas, but just for the purpose of going to there, where they have the marina, where they charge for the renting or storing of boats, harboring them or whatever the proper term is, only that particular area would be exempt and the adjacent areas.

SENATOR CARSTENS: Only that property that is in the leased portion, Senator Burbach.

SENATOR BURBACH: In the leased portion.

SENATOR CARSTENS: That is my understanding sir.

SENATOR BURBACH: Thank you.

SPEAKER: Any further discussion of the amendment? Senator Syas.

SENATOR SYAS: Yes a question. I know a recreation area that's got a restaurant that's leased right in the middle of it, how are you going to, if you don't charge the five bucks, how are you going to get around it, it's got a leased area? This is a little problem, quite a problem I think here.

SENATOR CARSTENS: This is a problem, Senator Syas this is a problem and that's the reason these people are concerned. I can't quite give you the answer, it's going to have to be administrated by the Department and they will have to come up with a regulation on it. They're going to have to any how, one way or another.
