CLERK: It's one amendment. You could do it either way.

SPEAKER: The chair will say that you are now taking up the first amendment.

UNIDENTIFIED: All right.

SPEAKER: I am going to have a machine vote. Those in favor vote aye. Those opposed vote nay. Senator Whitney voting aye.

CLERK: Senator Whitney voting aye.

SPEAKER: Have you all voted? We only need a majority vote on this. The clerk will read the vote.

CLERK: 19 nays, 10 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: The motion carries. Will the clerk read that second amendment, please?

CLERK: The second portion of the amendment is--read.

SPEAKER: The chair recognizes Senator Carsten.

SENATOR CAL CARSTEN: Mr. Chairman, members of the Legislature, this amendment actually puts back in the bill what our original intent and wording was. It was stricken in the Committee but upon further examination, it is my belief that the testimony that we heard from these people that do use campers in these areas, that the improvement part should be put back in it, and it was in our intent, I am sure, and I hope that the Chairman of our Committee will, also, speak to this. That these areas that our designated would be improved and updated to where the conveniences that are necessary for these people that use these areas that would be provided. So, actually, this puts back in what was stricken out of the original wording of the bill.

SPEAKER: The chair recognizes Senator Fred Carstens.

SENATOR FRED CARSTENS: I'd like to ask Senator Cal Carsten a question.

SPEAKER: Senator Carsten, do you yield?

SENATOR CAL CARSTEN: Yes.

SENATOR FRED CARSTENS: Now if we adopt this second amendment with the amendment we now have adopted, in effect as I understand it, now with the law as it is now or will be, we will have an admission fee to the State Parks, is that correct, and the special use areas?

SENATOR CAL CARSTEN: Yes, Senator Carstens, those areas that the Game and Parks Commission so designate.

SENATOR FRED CARSTENS: Ok. Now that's the first, the admission fee. Now, the second then after they get in having paid the admission fee in getting in, then. Now, if they go somewhere in the park in a special place to camp or whatever they do, have their camper trailers and so on, or tent, then they pay an additional fee. Is that correct?

SENATOR CAL CARSTEN: That isn't my understanding, sir. Once they've paid their fee, they are entitled to the privileges that are therein.

SENATOR FRED CARSTENS: You mean once they've paid to get in the park...
