thats what this Amendment is intended to do. The merits of the Bill itself, whether good or bad, in my opinion, should be discussed, when we discuss the Bill as a whole. Again I say, we've talked to the Bill and not to the Amendment. So I again move that the second Amendment be adopted. Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Now, Senator Syas, he was closing and so on, Do you understand the Amendment?

SENATOR SYAS: I do after reading it, and its, this this will help kill the Bill of course. May I say something, I mean ask, ok, ok, ok.

PRESIDENT: I think he's closed. I think that thats the end of the comment. Question is, shall the second half of the Carsten Amendment be adopted then. All those in favor will vote aye. All those opposed will vote no. Have you all voted? Your voting on the second half of the Carsten Amendment to LB 255. Now have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 23 ayes, 5 nays, 21 not voting.

PRESIDENT: Very good. The other half of the Carsten Amendment is adopted. Now we have to hold a minute.

CLERK: Mr. President, I had a motion to indefinitely postpone LB 255, signed Senator Carpenter.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter in the Chambers. I have your motion Senator Carpenter to indefinitely postpone LB 255.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well Mr. President, obviously many of us don't understand this Bill, but let's get back to the Bill itself. I'd like to ask Senator Carstens a question.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carstens, will you yield to a question?

SENATOR CARSTENS: I'll try to Senator Carpenter, however the Chairman of our Committee, I think would probably be the one to answer your question, but go ahead.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well I, I'll ask him again. Will the Chairman of the Committee yield? In line 5, in the Committee Amendment,

PRESIDENT: Senator Schmitt will you yield to a question?

SENATOR SCHMIT: Well I'd rather not, but I will.

PRESIDENT: Senator Syas.

SENATOR SYAS: At the Executive Meeting, I was not there. I'm Chairman of the Committee. Senator Anderson was Vice-Chairman there, so you better ask about the Committee Amendments of Senator Anderson, cause I was not Exec, at Executive Meeting.

SENATOR CARPENTER: The only purpose I have Senator, I'm not trying to trap you.

PRESIDENT: Ok, Senator Anderson will you yield to a question then?

SENATOR ANDERSON: I'll yield or attempt to get the answer some how.

PRESIDENT: Thank-you. All right, Sena, proceed Senator Carpenter.
