SENATOR CLARK: Mr. President, members of the legislature, I think this bill has been a long time in coming. I can see no reason why anyone school district should have to pay for the wards of the state, I think it is up to the state to pay for it, and I can certainly support this bill a hundred percent.

SPEAKER: Any further discussion of the bill? The question is shall LB 43 as amended now be advanced from general file to E&R initial, all those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote no. You are voting to advance LB 43 as amended by the Committee amendments from general file to E&R initial. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, no nays, 21 not voting Mr. President.

SPEAKER: The bill is advanced. Then we go back, the next order of business the Chair understands would be to continue the discussion of LB 255.

CLERK: Mr. President this is a bill that was introduced by Senator Schmit's Interim Committee on Agriculture, it is a bill for permit to enter the Nebraska State Park Areas, as prescribed. The title has been read, the committee amendments were adopted, an amendment by Senator Rasmussen was adopted, an amendment by Senator Cal Carstens was adopted, Senator Carpenter made a motion to indefinitely postpone the bill on March 14th, that motion is now pending.

SPEAKER: We still have before us relating to LB 255, the debate on the motion to indefinitely postpone, which was made by Senator Carpenter, the Chair had listed Senator Mahoney, Barnett, Simpson, Anderson, Frank Lewis and Marsh, Schmit, Johnson, and Nore, that were waiting in that particular order to be heard regarding the motion to indefinitely postpone. Now then, Senator Carpenter, lets start with you.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I move the previous question.

SPEAKER: Senator Carpenter is now moving the previous question, does the Chair see five hands. Thank you. The question is shall the debate now close on the motion to indefinitely postpone LB 255. All those in favor of closing debate will vote aye, all those opposed will vote no. The motion is to close debate on the motion to indefinitely postpone LB 255. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 7 nays, to cease debate.

SPEAKER: Alright, the debate will now close and Senator Carpenter, Senator Carpenter is now closing on his motion to indefinitely postpone LB 255. Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: As long as I closed on colleagues, I'll close it on myself.

SPEAKER: Very good. The question is shall LB 255 be indefinitely postponed, all those in favor will vote aye, all those opposed will vote no. All those in favor will vote aye, all those opposed will vote no. The motion is to indefinitely postpone LB 255. The debate has closed. The motion is to indefinitely postpone LB 255. Have you all voted? Once again have you all voted, the Clerk will record.

CLERK: 21 ayes, 16 nays, 12 not voting.

SPEAKER: LB 255 is indefinitely postponed. That brings up for general file consideration LB 268. 268 Senator Rasmussen's bill.
