SPEAKER: The chair recognizes Senator Whitney.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Mr. President, and members of the Legislature, the Speaker of the House has asked me to check with the Chairmans of all the Committees to see when we can start holding all day Legislative sessions. I have done so, as Chairman of the Committee on Committees, and there is no reason why we cannot start on the 26th, that would be week after next, with holding meetings of the Legislature. There are going to be Committee Meetings most of next week but the latest date would certainly be the 26th that we can start all day sessions and we, possibly, could start the preceding Friday, but there would still be some Committees in session. So, I'd like to announce that...I would like to as Chairman of the Committee on Committees that we start at least by the 26th all day sessions of the Legislature.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a communication.

SPEAKER: Thanks, Senator Whitney. Read the communication.

CLERK: Read.

SPEAKER: While the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I am signing Legislative Resolution 9. The chair would also like to mention to the body that seated under the south balcony is also another former...under the south balcony is another former member of this body., Ex-Senator Jack Romans of Ord, Nebraska, I believe, is out there some place. Senator Romans, would you step forward so we can recognize you? We are delighted that you have...Senator Romans, step out there. There he is. Let's give him a hand. We are delighted to have you as a visitor here today to the Nebraska Unicameral Legislature. Senator Syas, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR SYAS: This morning I was assigned a Resolution, I believe, to the Constitutional Revision Committee. Well, I think in the motion Senator Carpenter re...all right. Then, you'll get the material later but because on the day so people will know, I'd better set that for next Thursday, and then in the meantime, I'll hand it to you, Mr. Clerk, but...yes. Yes, next Thursday not today. That's our day that you normally meet. OK.

SPEAKER: Any other business to come before the body? Any other business on the desk?

CLERK: Motion to adjourn read.

SPEAKER: Motion is...I caught him. I introduced Jack Romans. Any other business to come before the body? The motion is to adjourn until 9 o'clock tomorrow morning. All those for the motion signify by saying aye. Those opposed say no. So ordered. We are adjourned until 9 o'clock tomorrow morning.
