PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter asking unanimous consent to bracket LB 311 on general file, are there objections? Hearing none, so ordered. Senator Duis for what purpose do you rise? Okay, that moves us down I assume to LB 68, Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President I'm sure that Senator Fred Carstens has an amendment up there on 68 which I'll object to so let's pass over 68, please.

PRESIDENT: 68A likewise.

SENATOR DUIS: Excuse me, Senator Carstens said he withdrew it.

PRESIDENT: Well, you want to consider LB 68 then?

SENATOR DUIS: The other amendments up there are not controversial.

PRESIDENT: Well let's test the water. Has the title been read?

CLERK: LB 68 was first considered on February 23rd, it was again considered on February 27th, the committee amendments have been adopted, Senator Carpenter has an amendment to LB 68 which was printed on the journal on March 6th and laid over, Senator Waldron has an amendment pending, Senator Waldron has two amendments pending, and Senator Epke has an amendment pending.

PRESIDENT: Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President, I believe the amendment that Senator Carpenter has printed in the journal is to be withdrawn and another amendment placed thereon.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter what about your amendment to LB 68 that was printed in the journal I believe on March 5th or 6th, are you withdrawing that?

SENATOR CARPENTER: Yes, I would ask unanimous consent to withdraw that because Senator Duis and I have agreed on another amendment which will take it's place.

PRESIDENT: Alright, any objections to Senator Carpenter's withdrawal of his amendment? Hearing none, so ordered. It is withdrawn. Can we have the next amendment, I believe what by Senator Waldron.
