

SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. President and Members of the body. This is a bill that was brought to me by the ESU people and they've decided that they don't need the bill, that they can get along without it and asked me to withdraw it so I'm hereby requesting.

PRESIDENT: Very good. That'll be laid over then. Request will be laid over--excuse me.

CLERK: The, the request was made to just move and we'll vote on it.

SENATOR CARSTEN: I, I so move, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Question is shall the bill be withdrawn. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote no. Was that 270?

CLERK: 278.

PRESIDENT: 278? Thank you. Voting on the withdrawal of L.B. 278 by, it's Senator Cal Carsten's request. Have you all voted? We need one more vote to withdraw the bill. Thank you. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The bill is withdrawn.

CLERK: Two notice of committee hearings, Mr. President, that's all.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Syas, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR SYAS: Are we going to do any more; are we going to adjourn or what?

PRESIDENT: Stand by. We're trying to find a bill we just for instance, passed over 148. Senator Stull isn't here. We're still trying to form a --

CLERK: L.B. 248, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: O.K. We'll move to the general file consideration of L.B. 248.

CLERK: L.B. 248. Introduced by Senator Glenn Goodrich, of the 20th district. (bill read) There are no committee amendments. There are now amendments by Senator Goodrich, (read).

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Mr. President and Members of the body. This is a bill that we took up on general file the other day which would let the governing boards of the three systems of higher education bring people here and pay their expenses when they were recruiting personnel, they could bring them here instead of the board going there. The sole purpose, in essence, is to reduce the expense and to make it more convenient to hire personnel. Now, Senator Carpenter at that time, raised an objection to the effect that we were opening it up too broad. We're listing the pe--type of people that they could bring in as other personnel. He felt that that was too broad. He objected to the bill. We dropped it at that time. We have drawn an amendment. We had Emory Burnett draw, draft an amendment to restrict it, excuse me, restrict it to the Director and the professional and managerial personnel and I have checked this with Senator Carpenter. He apparently has no objection. I would move the adoption of this amendment.
