SENATOR CARPENTER: I talked to Senator Johnson. The next bill is his. He thinks it'll only take a few minutes to do it while we're in the mood, I think we ought to pass as many bills as we can.

PRESIDENT: Very good.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Before we adjourn, why don't we take up his bill:

PRESIDENT: Is that 355? Chair has no objections of moving to 355. Senator Johnson.

SENATOR JOHNSON: Mr. President and Members of the Legislature.

PRESIDENT: Just a second, please, wait till the Clerk reads the title.

CLERK: Legislative Bill 355. Introduced by Senator Johnson of the 15th district. (bill read). There are no committee amendments or other amendments.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Johnson.

SENATOR JOHNSON: Mr. President and Members of the Legislature. This bill is real simple and the statute reads now that each class 6 school district shall have an elementary school coordinator who holds a valid Nebraska administrative and supervisory certificate in elementary education. The schools have been contacted by the Nebraska School Board Association and they are unanimous in their opinion that they do not need a coordinator, the superintendent can
