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to get done in the way of inspection with a bill that provides a fiscal impact of \$5,000 to hire inspectors. There isn't an electrician of any classification be he journeyman or certainly master electrician who is going to leave home for \$5,000. However as Senator Barnett has said last year it was the beginning this year it is a little bit more, and next year it will be a little more. I think that possibly the REA might have felt a good deal better in this regard had the bill not specified that the inspectors shall be a master electrician or a journeyman electrician and lets out any reference to anything other than a union electrician. Again I would question seriously where we are going with a \$5,000 inspection in the state of Nebraska. It is a beginning and I think that those who oppose it are properly and duly afraid of a bill that is this imperfect. If it needs doing I say lets do it properly, give it some time and like legislative process takes it due course.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Waldron.

SENATOR WALDRON: Mr. President, members of the legislature, as Chairman of the Miscellaneous Subjects Committee which heard this bill I would like to rise in support of Senator Lewis' motion. This bill was introduced by Senator Kime as we all know and he checked previously I believe about opposition to it. There was some indication that maybe the REA might have opposition to it therefore when he found that out he withdrew his name and Senator Lewis joined his name to the bill. Then to make sure that there would not be any objections from the REA we exempted the farmstead. We thought that would take out any resistance whatever from the REA who have a different type of operation than they might have in the more urban areas. Therefore at the committee hearing having taken...having made that exemption there was absolutely no opposition to the bill. The person appearing for it Mr. Shore, Paul Shore the third, happens not to be too friendly towards labor as many people think that this might be a labor bill. Mr. Shore happens to be a home builder who I have known for various years because I have sponsored a lot of bills for the home builders They are certainly not pro-labor and I'm certainly sure that he would not be involved in a bill that was. I would like to take those two issues out. I don't know what or why the REA is opposed to it. I don't think that their reasons are valid. They told us at one time that if the farmsteads they would not be opposed, and so therefore I would hope that we would raise this bill because I think that Senator Lewis and the others that are interested in this bill feel that it has an important purpose, that an added inspection to the various electrical installations and I think that it is also needed the committee was convinced that it was needed and as I pointed out once again there was no opposition whatsoever at that time, I have not heard any valid opposition on the floor today. So I hope that we would advance this..or return it to Final REading so that we can act upon it once again.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Luedtke.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Mr. Chairman, members of the Legislature I am also a member of the miscellaneous committee which heard this bill and there was not the opposition there I think it was unfair to bring in the opposition in this way the committee heard the bill, we felt that it was a worthy bill, Mr. Shore did appear and incidentally to correct the record Senator Waldron Mr. Shore is the president of the Electrical the State Electrical Board is a contractor an Electrical Contractor. He is on management side and you are quite correct. I'm sure that labor would not consider
