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him one of theirs. By a long shot. He was strongly in favor of this bill. I'm not suggesting that Mr. Shore doesn't get along with Labor but he is certainly on the management side and he is the executive of the management side and they are very strongly in favor of this bill and I would urge that we vote with Senator Frank Lewis' motion.

PRESIDENT: Well it is Senator Barnett's motion but that is alright. Senator Nore.

SENATOR NORE: Mr. President, fellow members, originally I supported this bill but I am sort of dubious about what this might be a foot in the door and we might have the same problems as we have with the fire marshall. Senator Barnett said what is that, well it was just Friday that a lady walked into my office in fact my former seat mate, here in the Legislature, and they have a multi-story residential retirement building in Omaha and it is almost new, and now the fire marshall comes along and says that they have to that the doors are only 37½ inches wide and they are going to have to cut out another 3 inches on each door and buy all new doors and to get the beds out in case of fire. Now the firemen, what do you do when you go to a fire as a former fireman, do you take the bed out first or do you ever remove the beds or do you get the human out first?

PRESIDENT: What was the question?

SENATOR NORE: You are a former fireman, and now if you go to a fire and do you remove the bed or do you remove the person first.

SENATOR BARNETT: Are they in it?

SENATOR NORE: Yes....

SENATOR BARNETT: I would take them both out the same time.

SENATOR NORE: Well...thats....

PRESIDENT: The motion before us of course is to suspend the rules and reconsider the action on 231. I know that it is easy to wonder away from that because it is a pretty tough subject to confine here and the Chair is under some pressures under that particular area. Chair recognizes Senator Carpenter. We are still speaking on the motion to reconsider the action. See if we can confine our remarks to that. Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: This will not be difficult in this case as far as I am concerned. This bill was heard before our committee and the gentlemen who I presume represented REA had no opposition to it then, what has happened since that time, I don't know. Now in answer to Senator Murphy it would seem to me that this bill is in two parts. One which is an authorization and followed by an A bill and now if the estimated \$5,000 is incorrect we should raise it but if we only want to pass the authorization and cut out the appropriation we can do that. But I don't think we ought to use one to defeat the other. I think that the bill has a great deal of merit and I think that certainly that somebody ought to inspect these things after they are authorized to be installed. I would hope that you would pass the authorization. Obviously if the method is followed if there is an A bill which I understand that there will be it will follow the authorization. One
