Senator Barnett is closing on his motion to suspend the rules and the procedure will be Senator Barnett that we will need to suspend the rules then we will need to vote on the reconsideration action then we have the bill on final reading then we read the bill again and away we go.

SENATOR BARNETT: That would be 30-25-30?

PRESIDENT: It will take 30 votes because it is to reconsider action that lacked the constitutional majority. According to the rules on page 40 it requires then 30 votes for passage. Chair recognizes Senator Barnett. In

SENATOR BARNETT: My closing I think that the bill has been discussed and I think that the merits of the bill and the opposition and how they came about making some kind of an entrapment would like to have you pay particular attention to page 3 of the bill and the new language where they make inspections to the electrical installations of its licensees who perform work. We have a license law in the state of Nebraska it is a volunteer license law. If you want to take an examination and have a state license, then you apply and when you get done there will be one or two people in the state that will make spot checks as to the work that you do which is related to your work. I'm sorry that Senator Snyder doesn't see fit to help us on this. I appreciate his views, I would wish that he could change his mind on this one due to the fact that the way it was lobbied and the way the letter was sent around giving a false indication of what the bill really done. I would think that his constituents and even in his own mind and conscience that he would be consistent to true, true politics and legislation in this body. I would think that he could be forgiven in this area. I would like to tell Senator Kelly that he knows from the questions that he asks that the architects have a stamp of approval given by the fire marshall's office when they submit plans. The big part of that statement was when they
