SENATOR CLARK: Mr. President, members of the body, it is certainly all right with me to bracket these until tomorrow, both of them, to see if we can get together on the two bills.

PRESIDENT: All right. We have a, apparently, consensus here on bracketing the two bills. Senator Carpenter, did you wish to be heard?

SENATOR CARPENTER: I would like to amend the motion to bracket one week. You can't get together by tomorrow on a bill like this. You are just wasting your time and spinning your wheels. I amend it or attempt to amend it to postpone it for a week. When it comes up that time, let's do something with either one of them or both of them.

PRESIDENT: The chair would observe that we do have three bills bracketed for tomorrow already. Would you gentlemen agree to Senator Carpenter's motion here to amending that bracketing to let's say, a week. Senator Clark, do you agree? Senator Kelly, would you agree to bracketing for a week?

SENATOR KELLY: Please repeat, I did not hear.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter suggested we amend the motion here to bracket the two bills for a week rather than till tomorrow. We have three bills to debate tomorrow already.

SENATOR KELLY: Ten seconds caucus.

PRESIDENT: Oh, OK.

SENATOR KELLY: John, is that all right with you?

PRESIDENT: Senator Cavanaugh, is it all right to bracket for a week?

SENATOR KELLY: Bob, is that all right with you.

SENATOR CLARK: Yes.

SENATOR KELLY: It is all right with me, we all agree.

PRESIDENT: That was a five second caucus. Very good. 193 and 342, then, are bracketed for a week and we will leave them in that condition. All right, that brings up the General File consideration, then, of LB 162. Senator Waldron's bill.

CLERK: Read title. LB 162. There are Committee amendments. Read.

PRESIDENT: Senator Luedtke is not in the chamber. Senator Luedtke, would we take up the amendments to LB 162 from the Judiciary Committee. 162.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I move the adoption of the Committee amendments to LB 162, which reinsert...reinstates the stricken matter on Page 2 and takes out all the matter from Lines 9 to 18. It takes that out. All it does is just simplify the bill by making it go back to a separate salary increase. That's all it does. Rather than go into all the matter, this is the Clerk Reporter's salary bill and the original bill had an adjustment for time of service and that sort of thing and this took all that out and just increased the salary.
