SENATOR SYAS: Well, I mean that you do admit that you did mislead us there a little bit unintentionally.

SENATOR SCHMIT: I don't admit a thing, Senator Syas.

PRESIDENT: Now, that completes, apparently, all the discussion. Senator Carpenter, do you want to be heard on this issue? We are still on the kill motion, actually, and we still haven't gotten, probably, although I know that the two bills have been discussed. We are still trying to get to Senator Schmit's explanation of 235. He's right there in front of you, but go ahead with your...

SENATOR CARPENTER: I have a very short statement. I say directly to Senator Schmit and Senator Chambers, there is no reason why they can't introduce this bill. We've got plenty of time to put these people and give them all the publicity. I challenge you to do it and I'll bet you a hundred to one, and I'm talking about dollars, you can't get this body to do it. Now these are all acceptable diversionary tactics. You can always find out some other place where something ought to be done that isn't being done, but there is no limitation to any member of this body. Even now they introduce a bill to solve those things we are now complaining about which is really an excuse and not a reason, but I hope Senator Schmit will bring the bill in. I'll support it. I'll attempt to get the Executive Council to put it in any Committee he wants to be put in, his Committees or even the Miscellaneous Subjects Committee. I think it will get out of there.

PRESIDENT: Well, now, the chair is going to assume that you're through discussing the kill motion here on LB 185 and, also, it is the chair's understanding that we weren't going to go ahead and take a vote on this until we're through discussing LB 235 which is Senator Schmit's bill, so that we can get to the discussion of that. I know that the discussion has been interrelated and has flowed back and
