PRESIDENT: All right. You're all through discussing the amendment? Senator Goodrich, do you want to close on your amendment? Senator Goodrich is closing on his amendment now.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Just to remind the body that you are not spending \$3,000,000 on this bill, you are spending \$8,000,000 but with this you keep--limit to about a million and a quarter.

PRESIDENT: Question is shall the amendment be adopted. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote no. You are voting on the Goodrich amendment to L.B. 235. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 17 ayes, 19 nays.

PRESIDENT: The Goodrich amendment is lost. We're now back to L.B. 235. Senator Schmit, any closing on the bill?

SENATOR SCHMIT: I have no closing, Mr. President. I'm ready to move the bill.

PRESIDENT: Question is, shall L.B. 235 be advanced from general file to E&R initial. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote no. Motion is to advance L.B. 235 from general file to E&R initial. Have you all voted? Well--Senator Chambers has asked for a call of the house. Clerk will clear the board. The next bell, please indicate your support. Chambers, Senator Chambers motion for a call of the house. Senator Chambers is asking for a call of the house. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 7 nays.

PRESIDENT: Motion for a call of the house prevails. We are now under a call of the house. Next bell please indicate your presence so we can determine who's missing. I'd like to ask the Senators, please take their seats, we're under a call of the house. We are asking you to indicate your presence. Clerk will record. Motion under vote is whether L.B. 235 as amended shall be advanced from general file to E&R initial. Senator Carpenter, for what purpose do you rise.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I changed my vote from no to aye, just to get the bill over. It'll be sticky by the time it gets on final reading.

PRESIDENT: All right. Senator Carpenter voting aye. Senator Chambers has asked to raise the call. Clerk will clear the board. All those in favor of raising the call vote aye. All those opposed vote no. Thank you. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 40 ayes to raise the call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Call is raised. What's the tally on the original vote?

CLERK: 25 ayes, 15 nays.

PRESIDENT: L.B. 235 is advanced from general file to E&R initial. All right, do we have any other business on the desk?

CLERK: Yes, Mr. President. Committee reports read. Excused, permission asked to be excused.
