I don't know whether you move to amend his motion or not, he says it's alright, I'm sorry. Alright, then we will see what happens after that, Senator Whitney, do you have any discussion of this motion. The motion before us really is that we move to have all day sessions beginning Monday, that's really the motion, is there any further discussion of the motion? All those in favor of voting to have all day sessions beginning Monday vote aye, all those opposed vote no. The motion is that we have all day sessions beginning next Monday, okay, have you all voted? The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, no nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Okay, the motion carries. Now Senator Chambers do you want to offer one involving Friday?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I will go ahead and make the motion in the major modifications. I would move that we do not meet on Friday, for the remainder of the session.

PRESIDENT: Very good, is there further discussion of that motion, Senator Burbach.

SENATOR BURBACH: I'd like to amend this motion, and we make a determination each Friday, that we, whether we are in session the following Friday, each Friday or each Monday, that we make a determination whether we will be in session that following Friday, because there may be times when we want to meet and I'm certain, I feel this is too broad, Senator Chambers motion is too broad, that we, too all inclusive, so I prefer to make this decision each week, but do it early in the week or at the end of the week for the following Friday. So therefore, I would amend his motion to say that on each Friday morning we determine whether we meet the following Friday or not.

PRESIDENT: Or at least not later than the next Monday to determine whether you were meeting the next Friday or not. Alright, we have Senator Burbach now amending Senator Chambers motion, Senator Carstens, we have now the amendment before us.

SENATOR CARSTENS: Yes, I'd like to speak to the amendment, Mr. President and members of the legislature. I think possibly a week ahead is projecting a little bit too far. Over the week end there may be plans made for the next week end, I would suggest that we make this on Monday whether we meet the Friday of that week, I think we will be projected through that week maybe, better then we would the whole week before. I would, I would make this suggestion Senator Burbach and maybe he would have a response to it, sir.

PRESIDENT: Senator Burbach.

SENATOR BURBACH: I gladly agree to that suggestion.

PRESIDENT: Alright then now your amendment then you've agreed that you will take it off as for Friday, but that each Monday will determination.

SENATOR BURBACH: Each Monday morning will make a determination whether we meet on that Friday of that week.

PRESIDENT: Alright, now the Burbach amendment to the Chambers amendment then says that we will determine on Monday whether we meet the following Friday or not, is there need for further discussion of that amendment? All those in favor of that amendment say aye, those opposed say no. So ordered, the amendment is carried, now we have Senator Chambers motion which would say that we do not meet on Friday, but that that would
