PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter's asking unanimous consent to adopt the emergency clause. Are there any objections to adopting the emergency clause on 381? Any objections? PRESIDENT: L.B. 381 is advanced. Now--

CLERK: Senator Whitney asked unanimous consent to be excused.

PRESIDENT: Are there objections to Senator Whitney's absence? Hearing none, it is so ordered. Senator Maresh, what's the number, excuse me, Senator Snyder, did you wish to be recognized?

CLERK: Senator Dick Lewis asked unanimous consent to be excused.

PRESIDENT: Are there objections? Hearing none, so ordered.

SENATOR SNYDER: Mr. President, I hate to bring it into our Friday morning togetherness session, but I have a great need to get to Omaha and I would like unanimous consent to be excused also. We're a little short on our tally board if three of us leave here.

PRESIDENT: Well, we only have one more bill here apparently. Senator Marvel?

SENATOR MARVEL: Well, I, I think, you barely have a quorum. I think we ought to adjourn.

PRESIDENT: All right. We do have a motion to adjourn up here anyway. That's probably a pretty good place to saw it off. Clerk has some business here that has to come before the body.
