SPEAKER: Committee amendments have been adopted. Are there any other amendments, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Yes. Mr. President, Senator Carpenter's amendment... Senator Carpenter offered some amendments, Mr. President, that are on Page 607 of the Legislative Journal.

SPEAKER: Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President, I, also, have communications from Senator Carpenter and ask if I would go along...would go and take his amendments to the bill which I will be very happy to do because they have been agreed upon and everything as far as the Real Estate Commission is concerned and myself and Senator Carpenter in agreement. So if you will go ahead...do you have the copies of the amendment...

CLERK: Ya. Mr. President, I have a note here that Senator Carpenter's amendments on Page 607 are to be withdrawn and another set substituted.

SENATOR DUIS: That's right, and you have that new amendment up there.

CLERK: Yes.

SPEAKER: Is there any objection to withdrawing the Carpenter amendments. If not, it is so ordered. That is his first amendments. Now, does he have other amendments, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Yes. OK. Now, Mr. President, the next one in line is an amendment by Senator Duis. This is found on Page 608 of the Legislative Journal. It would add--read.

SPEAKER: Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President, I move the adoption of the amendment. This amendment was put on there to clear up any misunderstanding that might be there that would allow the state Tax Commissioner or the Highway Department and such as that to use their appraisers without the necessity of having the license fee paid because they are regular employees and we wish to go along with the federal government and the state government in regard to this.

SPEAKER: Any further discussion of the amendment?

CLERK: Mr. President, there are some changes from the one that was printed in the Journal and the one that I now have. You had deleted the word "for tax purposes" on the copy that I had.

SENATOR DUIS: That is correct.

CLERK: All right. That should be an amendment because the other one was printed in the Journal.

SENATOR DUIS: That's correct.

SPEAKER: Do you have the correct amendment, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: We will have to amend the one and it will read to simply delete the words "for tax purposes", signed, Senator Duis.
