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of this with the cooperation of the other subdivision of Government. He said the only problem that they might have in the rules, as they come along, they'll be able to determine whether the five legislative days plus the other five days are sufficient for them to get this information together but they said they're willing to go along with this rule change in the fiscal analyst's office at the present time if they do run into trouble because of the additional days that it might require to get this information together so that we will have for our body here a fiscal note as to what this--what the bill will cost the counties and the municipalities, said they will go along with it so we recommend this rule to be changed to consider this.

PRESIDENT: Is there any further discussion of the rule change? Well then, the question is, shall the rule change be adopted? Are we going to take these one at a time, Senator Duis?

SENATOR DUIS: Please, if you will.

PRESIDENT: All right. Question is, shall the rule change then be adopted? All those in favor will vote aye. All those opposed will vote no. Voting on Rule Change Number 1 as explained by Senator Duis. Have you all voted? Clerk will record. Well, Senator Stull would you push Senator Carpenter's button there? He's voting aye but this does require a machine vote. Thank you. For your information we have one aye vote already in the machine by a malfunction this morning so everything takes 31 votes on the board. Okay. The rule change is adopted. That's the problem. There is one already up there, it's a malfunction. No green lights are on it's just registers one already and the total. Back to you, Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President and Members of the Legislature. The second rule change that we considered was one that was made by Senator Carpenter that would state that no one should be excused on Friday except for illness, sickness, and the Rules Committee decided to suggest rejection of this so if there is no vote out here, we will consider it rejected unless anyone wants to bring it up on the floor and I'll give you that opportunity right now. It's been rejected by the Rules Committee.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of that rule change; proposed rule change which was rejected? Well, all right, hearing none, we'll bypass it.

SENATOR DUIS: The next one now, I would like very much if you'd pay close attention to, it's a rule change that was brought in by Senator Syas and the rule change you'll find on the same page of your Legislative Journal as stated before, but we did amend his rule change at the same time that he brought it in and I'm sure he's in complete agreement with us. If he isn't, he'll have to make his wishes known now but I believe that he is. This has to do with Rule 6, Sections 4 and 5, Consideration of bills on select file. Now follow closely if you don't mind please, because this, this will change your thinking on select file. What we did here or what Senator Syas brought forth to us, was that an amendment on select file will no longer be put on there by unanimous consent. The way the rule will read now in Section 4, it will read (rule change read). There was a change in the select file voting procedure which is a reference and for reference only, so that it will reflect the majority of elected members on select file rather than unanimous consent. Section 5(read). That completes--and this was asked to be adopted by the Legislature. What it does, it does away with the unanimous consent amendment on select file and makes it a requirement
