PRESIDENT: Now is there any further discussion of that rule change? Are you ready for the question? Question is, shall the rule change then involving Rule 6, Sections 4 and 5, be adopted? All those in favor will vote aye. All those opposed will vote no. Voting on the rule change to Rule 6, Sections 4 and 5. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 3 nays, 14 not voting.

PRESIDENT: Rule change is adopted.

SENATOR DUIS: Then gentlemen, if we may have your complete attention again, once more. We got another one here that is going to make a drastic change. I shouldn't say a drastic change. What the Committee believes is a change probably for the best and has recommended it for approval so we give it to you for your consideration and this one was sent to us by both Senators Warner and Senator Maresh; proposed changes in the rule section to the same place and we kind of molded them together and made something out of it and it is Rule 5, Section 13. Now this rule change has to do with carrying bills over from the odd year--sessions to the even years and I'll read this, if you'll follow me please. (Rule 5 read). Now what this does, what we have done before, we had a mad rush to get bills out of committee up on general file so they could be carried over to the next session. We came back into the even numbered years with a whole flock of bills up here on general file and I daresay there are some that the meaning was lost and we were considering bills on general file that probably should have been disposed of another way. Now what would happen under this new rule, all the bills that are left in committee will be alive and those bills on general file will be sent back to the committee where they were heard for reconsideration again before they go back on general file. We think this recommendation by Senator Maresh and Senator Warner had a lot of merit because there may have been change of thinking and if they go back to the same committee that heard them in the first place, they're going to have records on them and they're going to be able to go over them again and decide whether they want them back up there on general file. It will also stop this deal of, if we could get my bill out of committee and up there on general file, no matter where you got it so that it stays alive to the next session and it may promote the killing of some bills in committee right now that are just being left there to die a peaceful death and I think this is good too and I believe this is the way the committee felt and with that explanation I'll leave it to your consideration and any discussion on the floor but we felt this
