SENATOR CARPENTER: Do you know of any area west of North Platte which is doing this now?

SENATOR KENNEDY: I'm not too well acquainted west of North Platte, but in the horse trading game I could go further, but in the hospital we'd have to refer to you or Senator Whitney, or nursing service.

SENATOR CARPENTER: If it will help clear up your area, in whether people are doing something they can't legally do, I'm for the bill if that's the purpose of it.

SENATOR KENNEDY: Yeah, that's the intent of the bill, and I was not aware of Senator Goodrich's amendment, I don't think it hurts the bill, or I hope that it doesn't, but I feel that it gives another avenue maybe that where the specially populated west of North Platte, it might even help, if they could hire a nurse out of that hospital.

SENATOR CARPENTER: But your purpose and intent was that you have the problem in your area your district, and your doing things now that they didn't know until recently they couldn't do, -

SENATOR KENNEDY: Yes that's true.

SENATOR CARPENTER: And your trying to help them, -

SENATOR KENNEDY: That's correct.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I want to help you.

SENATOR KENNEDY: I think I appreciate that and I'm sure that as I understand the amendment, it does say the amendment does say that it must be a licensed hospital, so that there is no question about where the service would come from, if there is no further questions, I would move that LB 463, the simple bill as amended be advanced to general file.
