SENATOR CARPENTER: Well, I don't make anything, you're the one that makes things personal, not me.

SENATOR WARNER: I thought the truth would come out.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I remember one statement that you said that this body would regret what they'd done.

SENATOR WARNER: I, I don't think it--

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well, I'd like to hold the bill over until I get some expert advice as the interpretation of the language, what it provides for and what might happen.

SENATOR WARNER: That's fine.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Okay. --hold it over until Monday or Tuesday of next week.

SPEAKER: The Chair, before we hold this over, Senator Keyes had a statement to make, I think.

SENATOR KEYES: Yes, while they're holding this over, I would like Senator Warner and Senator Carpenter to consider this. If special permits may be issued for truck or tractor or semi trailer combinations of farmers and ranchers; now if we're going to permit these farmers and ranchers to buy a commercial license to haul, then let's make them legal commercial haulers for one month at one-twelfth the fee or \$25.00 whichever is the greater. Now that's all we need to do in this bill and it will license it up and it will let the farmers and the ranchers have exactly what Senator Warner is trying to do and they can haul anything from peaches to popcorn to powder puffs or anything they wish to haul because they have a commercial license that is issued specially to a farmer and a rancher. Thank you.

SPEAKER: Did Senator Syas wish to speak? Senator Nore?

SENATOR NORE: I, Mr. President, I rise to ask a question of Senator Warner. How would this one month, 30-day permit--

SPEAKER: Senator Warner's not in his chair, Senator Nore.

SENATOR NORE: Well, how would this permit work for 30 days-- when did you start your harvest last fall. Are you through yet? How would this 30-day permit work for you in case you bought one of these permits?

SENATOR WARNER: I, we don't use any of this kind of equipment Senator Nore.

SENATOR NORE: Well, let's say you did, let's say one of your neighbors do. How would it work for him, when we harvest all winter?

SENATOR WARNER: Normally here, you'd have two of them, two 30-day permits would handle it. This last winter obviously,--

SENATOR NORE: I can't hear.
