PRESIDENT: Alright, Senator Carpenter back to you.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well in order to be gracious to the lady, I's ask if she would remove her objection, and I have no objection to her attempting to raise the 30 to 90 days.

PRESIDENT: Alright, now we are back.

SENATOR MARSH: Senator Carpenter, when I tried to amend your motion, I was not under the impression that 90 days would have us disregarding the Federal law, I feel now that if the Federal law says 180 days, it simply takes the jurisdiction out of the state's hands and I would prefer to see it in, under the rules and regulations of the state of Nebraska, rather than having it be under Federal rules and regulations.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well, would the lady agree that we have already violated the form of the Federal Government and probably under the Federal anyway, is that true?

PRESIDENT: Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: I'm not in a position to answer that, I think perhaps Senator Fowler could say if the penalty clause would put us under Federal regulation, I'm more inclined to think that the days at which this could be filed would be more likely to put us under Federal regulations.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well, what does the lady prefer?

SENATOR MARSH: I prefer this section being left as it was proposed by Senator Fowler.

SENATOR CARPENTER: By 180 days.

SENATOR MARSH: Yes.

SENATOR CARPENTER: That I'm unopposed to.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter then is asking unanimous consent to withdraw that portion of his amendment. Are there any objections to that, hearing none, so ordered. Then it's the Chair's understanding it leaves it as the original bill is at 180 days, or is it 108 days? 180 days, okay fine, are there any objections to that?

SENATOR CARPENTER: That's only her desire.

PRESIDENT: Pardon me sir.

SENATOR CARPENTER: That's only her desire, the Senator's desire. I'm going to get out of her way, I'm going to let her attempt to impose her judgement on the body, if she doesn't succeed, then I want to go back to the 30 days.

PRESIDENT: Alright, now we are, we have now the Marsh amendment to this which would restore the 180 days, is that the Chair's understanding of your motion, we've really, the Chair's not under the impression that you don't need an amendment to that it's already in the bill, please clarify your amendment.

SENATOR MARSH: Mr. President, I withdraw my amendment to Senator Carpenter's amendment, and I encourage the body to vote no on Senator Carpenter's amendment so that this law will be in conformity with the Federal regulations meaning that the state has the jurisdiction.

PRESIDENT: Thank you, it's the Chair's understanding that if you withdraw your amendment, Senator Carpenter has withdrawn his, and therefore there is no need of the amendment because
