The child is an independent human being and I think that Senator Marvel's proposition is valid. I think the time for this idea has arrived and as Senator Marsh and others have pointed out, it's just to put the issue on the floor, Senator Oyas, the man who always wants those being affected to have a chance to vote. This is the kind of inconsistency that you should not show. I am not as inconsistent as Terry Carpenter but there will be inconsistencies if a person observes me in a superficial way because I feel that circumstances alter cases. I feel that if you're dealing with a Board or a Commission, the way you put people on that Board or Commission will be determined by the circumstances surrounding it. The nature of appointment will also be determined by the goals and aims of that Commission. When we look at what the Board of Regents is suppose to do, when we see the impossibility of a student winning an election to that Board, the only way to deal with that situation is to do something like what Senator Marvel is talking about but I don't see why the Legislature should fear to discuss the issue and if it comes on the floor, I will not have anything else to say about it except to support it and vote to put it on the ballot.
