We have hundreds of students from our, my district at the University, I've had no requests from any of these students or parents for this kind of legislation, and personally I think probably we are spending \$15,000.00 and we are spinning our wheels, don't think the people, my constituents really want this, and I don't know for sure, but I don't believe they do, and the University must be doing a pretty good job, it's the only school I think in the state of Nebraska that doesn't have that of any size that doesn't have an increase, or doesn't have a decrease in enrollment, and our rating is fairly high, and I'm wondering if probably having a student on the school board
