

SENATOR BURBACH: Senator Dickinson yield to a question.

PRESIDENT: Senator Dickinson, will you yield to a question?

SENATOR DICKINSON: Yes.

SENATOR BURBACH: Senator Dickinson, do you know what the definition, I don't, but do you know what the definition of a trailer is as used in this instance?

SENATOR DICKINSON: I am only going by what is listed, what is stated in paragraph 19 in this bill under Section...page 6, paragraph 19 defines a farm trailer. As the bill was explained the other day, it was my opinion, but I forget who explained it, Senator Nore was not here, that they were trying to clarify this provision and after consulting with some other people, it didn't seem that this had been accomplished and so this simple amendment that I am offering would seem to me to accomplish what the bill was attempting to do. Now, in answer...

SENATOR BURBACH: I will yield to Senator Nore.

SENATOR DICKINSON: May I comment to Senator Anderson's comments about collecting ad...

PRESIDENT: Go ahead.

SENATOR DICKINSON: ..collecting ad valorem tax, I would assume then that Senator Anderson is assuming that we are not honest and we are not paying our personal property tax because this is personal property and is taxed as such and in spite of all the efforts of this body one year ago, it still is taxed. So, I can see where this would have...I can't see where this would have any bearing on it, particularly. And secondly, concerning his statements, it is a very difficult thing to enforce to require a farmer to have a license for every....I wonder if some of you realize how many vehicles you have around the farm you tie behind a tractor sometimes and use for some purpose. To attempt to require a license specifically for each one of these would be impractical and unenforceable.

PRESIDENT: All right. Stand by, Senator Dickinson. Senator Whitney, did you wish to be heard on this amendment, then Senator Nore?

SENATOR WHITNEY: Mr. President, I was just going to say I didn't see anything wrong with the amendment, and wouldn't this just be a unanimous consent amendment?

PRESIDENT: Well, it used to be except we changed the Rules, Senator.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Oh.

PRESIDENT: Just the other day. That's what makes this job interesting. Senator Nore.

SENATOR NORE: Mr. President, and fellow members, the purpose of 384 was to take the ambiguousness out of the right to pull a trailer on a road or a highway without
