SENATOR FOWLER: I'd like to advance the bill to E&R initial.

SPEAKER: Senator Syas has a question?

SENATOR SYAS: The other day we toyed with the idea of 15 and 25 employees, now what does the Federal Government require? Is that now in the bill, I'm just asking a question?

SPEAKER: Senator Fowler, can you answer?

SENATOR FOWLER: The requirements now that have gone into effect this month is 15 employees, the bill as it is written now follows the Federal law point by point, identical.

SPEAKER: Any further discussion? Are you ready for the question, the question is shall the bill be advanced as amended all those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. This bill requires 25 votes for advancement. The Speaker will take your motion in just a moment. Have you all voted? Thirty more seconds, counting. Alright a call of the house, whoops, the Clerk will record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 5 nays, 17 not voting Mr. President.

SPEAKER: The bill is advanced as amended, LB 266. While we are waiting here, under the south balcony we have some distinguished guests, some gentlemen and a lady, they are from Iran, that's Persia isn't it? I guess, and I would not be so foolish as to even attempt to pronounce all these names, but one of them is preceded by the word Governor so I'm going to have to try on that, and nobody will ever know that I'm wrong, Governor Ravai and his party in the south balcony, will you please stand up, we would like to recognize you folks, under the north balcony, pardon me. Excuse me, the page says they are all Governor's except the girl. Persian women are certainly beautiful, I'll say that. Alright now what bill are we on, what, well the introducer of the last bill isn't here so, we will take up LB 415, if that is agreeable with you Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I want to ask the presiding officer as long as a woman is not a Governor what's your position on that?

SPEAKER: That's none of your business. LB 415 the Clerk will read.

CLERK: Title Read LB 415. The bill has previously been considered, on March 23rd, the title was read the bill was considered and laid over. No committee amendments or other amendments pending. Senator Maresh now has an amendment Mr. President.

SPEAKER: The Clerk will read.

CLERK: Read.

SPEAKER: Senator Maresh.

SENATOR MARESH: Mr. President, what this amendment does, for those trucks that are used wholly for, solely for carrying campers if a man, a farmer buys a pickup and leaves his camper on at all times, this would not allow him to have a farm license, this would allow only farm trucks used for carrying farm products and occasionally place a camper on he would be able to use a farm license. Mr. President and members of the legislature I move that this amendment be adopted.
