

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? Senator Keyes?

SENATOR KEYES: Yes, Mr. President. I think Senator Maresh has made a request here, but the thing of it is if you have a mobile home and it can weigh up to 12,000 pounds and you can get a license on it, am I right, Senator Maresh, for \$15? Is that right? You got the figures there in front of you. A--yeah, let me have them. I got these figures the other day and I don't object to a farmer putting his camper on it. That's all right. It'll save me about \$15, but here's the thing, a self-propelled unit up to 8,000 pounds, can be bought for \$15; 8,000 pounds, that's a 4 ton. If I put the same thing on a commercial license on mine, I got to pay \$25 for it. Now there's no reason under the sun why I should pay \$25 for a unit that goes on my pickup that costs \$1500 to \$2000 and some boy can drive down the road with a \$15,000 or \$20,000 mobile home for \$15. Now I would like to have this thing corrected. Now if it goes between 8 and 12,000 pounds and that's a 6 ton, then he pays \$25, but if I go to 6 tons on my truck, I don't know what it is, but I know that it'll be up to around \$40 or \$45. Now there is, a farmer can come along here and up to a 1 ton truck, a 3/4 ton pickup he can put his camper on there and haul it under Senator Maresh's bill which is alright with me for \$18, I'll be able to do that, but where he says that it's got--it sets on there the year around and mine will probably set on mine most of the year around so I'm going to be penalized and forced to buy a commercial license. All I want you to know is by this, that we have a very indiscriminatory pattern of pri--prices on the licenses that we have and I think Senator Maresh does justice to this beings as he has opened the subject. He should go and correct these taxes, correct this permit fee. I don't understand why I should allow a man who has one of these high priced units to ride for about 40 or 50% of what I have to pay. That's the only thing. Go ahead and pass the bill if don't want to correct the prices.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kime. We're still speaking on the Maresh amendment to L.B. 415.

SENATOR KIME: Well, Mr. President, I'll go along with Maresh on this bill. These campers we're talking about, that he's talking about are, are mobile campers that you put on your pickup, maybe you take a trip with them, you have them on there for two or three weeks. You take them off and then you want to use your pickup. That's why you have--that's why you want your farm license. You don't--we don't especially leave these pickup--these campers on here all the time and that's the ones I think, that Senator Maresh has reference to.

PRESIDENT: Now, Senator Syas.

SENATOR SYAS: Well, that's the point. There's people with a pickup in cities that do the same thing and I just wondered if they're getting discriminated against because--

PRESIDENT: Let's stop carrying the dialogue on the floor--

SENATOR SYAS: --and they take their--

PRESIDENT: If you're going to ask a question, ask a question.

SENATOR SYAS: --and they take theirs off and on, you know, just like the farmer does. Oh no, not necessarily. I know a lot of people who haul plumbing tools one, one day and they're out on a camper on the next, on the same truck.

PRESIDENT: Let's not forget--we can't transcribe the dialogue on the floor. Senator Stull.

SENATOR STULL: Mr. President and Members of the Legislature. I think we're fooling with something that there is a lot of dynamite
