ASSISTANT CLERK: Reading.

CLERK: Mr. President a motion on the desk.

PRESIDENT: Read the motion on the desk.

CLERK: Read.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Rasmussen. We have your motion regarding LB 268, Senator Rasmussen. What is your pleasure?

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: I would ask Mr. Speaker to this body okay that motion.

PRESIDENT: I'm sorry I didn't hear you, to do what?

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: I would ask for this body to okay that motion, it is corrective in the bill that was eliminated by 146.

PRESIDENT: Alright, let's have the Clerk read the motion again, this is the motion from Senator Rasmussen, please pay attention to the motion.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 2 nays, 22 not voting.

PRESIDENT: The motion is adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President -

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR CARPENTER: I want to move that the bills that Senator Barrett introduced 14 in number I think there was, be put on general file without a hearing. I have contacted all of the executive council who ha. the prime responsibility for reference, as far as I know they have no objection, now the membership can understand and know that you can always object to anyone or all of them when they are there and you can automatically require a public hearing, on one or all of them, and the bills have to be on general file five days, before you can do anything with them, in the meantime the bills will be printed and ready for your consideration, and I think one of these days when we don't have too much to do with uncontroversial bills then we can probably pass all of these or reject some of them and pass the rest of them, so I so move. It will expedite the business and get the bills drafted and the reference committee as I understand it has no objection.
