SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'm not going to quarrel with that, I'm, now do you feel that the religious beliefs that you have should be imposed on me?

SENATOR MARVEL: No sir.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Do you feel that the religious views you have should -

SENATOR MARVEL: By the same token I don't think the religious views that you have should be imposed on me either.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Do you feel that the deletion of this amendment is an imposition of my religious views on anybody? If we don't accept the amendment, how is that the, the imposition of my religious views? The statute is just remaining silent with reference to religion, nobody's views is being imposed by means of statute. No body's religion -

SENATOR MARVEL: Yes, I, I, I'm sorry sir, but I believe that if you do not approve this particular amendment, you are, you are going contrary to some other statutes that have been passed to recognize certain organized religions.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If, may I ask one more question, then I'll leave it alone.

SENATOR PROUD: Please do.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But I think it is a very serious issue, in fact I know that it is.

SENATOR MARVEL: I wouldn't be standing up here if I didn't think it was a serious
