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Governor. I don't see it this way but I don't want to take your time by...I have another point I want to make but I will make it on my own time rather than penalize you. I don't see this as weakening the office of the Governor, but I do see this as strengthening this very important department so that other parts of the Executive Branch are included and I think this is important and at times is overlooked.

SENATOR KELLY: As you might would guess, I am having an extremely difficult time with LB 452 and I am going to have to vote on it today.

SENATOR MARVEL: That's why I appreciate your questions because as you can see I feel quite strongly about this and I am perfectly willing to answer whatever questions anybody wants to bring up and I do appreciate yours.

SENATOR KELLY: Then a question of the chair, is there any way that a poor man like me could make up his mind tomorrow or the next day on this bill, rather than today?

PRESIDENT: Sure, if somebody wants to withdraw the motion that has been made and that is, of course, at this time, to return LB 452 to Select File for specific amendment. If Senator Carpenter wants to recall that motion why then that would give you time to delay. The bill is, 452, is bracketed until the 4th which is Wednesday. You can hold it then or you can rebracket it for another time. Any number of things could be done, Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY: I plead for leadership.

PRESIDENT: All right, sir. Thank you, and stand by just a moment. Senator Carpenter, do you care to respond?

SENATOR CARPENTER: Yes. This thing has been postponed a number of times. I don't think the body will be any more knowledgeable tomorrow, the day after, than they are today and I think we ought to, at least, continue discussion until everybody is through talking including the Senator who made the motion. If at that time, the body wants to hold over I would have no objection but what I am trying to find out is just one thing. If you've got thirty votes, use them. Run over the guy. Have your way. But if you don't have thirty votes, you're dead, and then what are you going to do if you are so concerned about the Governor of the state if he wins. What are you going to put...what position are you going to put him in. To the victor belongs the spoils. If you don't succeed and run over, he is going to run over you because you are asking for it.

PRESIDENT: The chair next recognizes Senator Chambers and then Senator Frank Lewis. Then Senator Marvel and Carpenter have both asked to speak. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, this is a very serious discussion on a very serious issue. I am aware of that so, if during the course of my presentation, I smile now and then, it's just because there are times when I have a good feeling and I can't contain myself and it shows on my face. When I look at Governor Exon and the Legislature, I see this particular bill as an issue between the Executive and the Legislative Branches of the government in Nebraska and the Governor has a way of portraying himself as "big daddy Jim" to the Legislature. I took personal offense at some of the things he said in Senator Marvel's letter. Although it was addressed to Senator Marvel, it was to include all of us. If you boys can't get what you want from the DAS, why you come on up to "big daddy" and he will take care of it if he decides that you are worthy of having the information. So everybody is suppose to trot over
