Now this thing is way out of it's proportion, I don't think this bill and there is a difference of opinion of course, takes anything away from the Governor, because we can't take anything away from the Governor. His responsibilities are outlined in a broad sense. They have never been defined to the point where we really are sure where the dividing line might be. In our own fiscal staff which is now under the competent Chairman of Budget Committee, and we have a staff for the first time which is going to cost a lot of money, it's been a long time coming, six or eight years ago we authorized the creation of the staff, they had the money, but they never did it. They never did it. A member of the executive council then, under the leadership they had there, I presume were afraid of information, and they were hesitant about being criticized for the spending of money in order to give this body some information. As an illustration I've set on this body for 15 years, I have never had any actual knowledge of the need of any money bill I have ever voted on for or against, and I don't think you have had any more information than I have, and I don't think the budget committee up to this time had any more than they had, and I don't think the Governor of this state has any more knowledge than any of the others, individually or collectively. Now this commission we are talking about, what do they do? I would presume that part of the responsibility is to determine whether the intent of this body is being carried out by who? By the legislature as well as the executive branch of Government. It's an independent agency, and I would presume that once the Governor appointed a membership if he did, or if we keep those five who are now in the authority or would be if appointed and the bill passed, I don't think it makes any difference, I don't think you can grade people by a lack of desire and put one against the other insofar as the responsibility to state Government is concerned. You can simmer this thing down to the point that if you don't adopt the amendment, now let's go a little further, I'm going to ask for a record vote, in order to determine what, if I get 20 votes to adopt this amendment, and if you people do what I think you will do, then that means you're not going to override the Governor's veto, and that only leaves 29 left, and every time we get one above 21, eliminates that percentage that much more. Now let's just pursue this thing, let's say as an illustration, that we do override, we do override, we don't override the Governor, and we leave in his possession those things which he thinks now is his. Do you think with all the things that have been said on this floor today and in the past and the future, it's going to make him any more cooperative? Let me ask you a personal question, if you was in his position, what would you do? I know what I'd do, fortunately not many people like I am, at least to a certain degree I presume you'd all do about the same thing, you've whipsawed him and I have no belief for the Governor, he doesn't need my support, he doesn't need anything that I've got. I give it to him when I think he is entitled to it and I take it away from him when I don't. In answer to Senator Snyder, I have never on this floor done anything that was not becoming to a Senator, I have never defended the Governor, I have never done any favors for him that I haven't said so at the time I did it, and while I appreciate his nomination for me for the Chairman of this committee, that has nothing to do with it. I've done things as the Chairman of this committee that have never been done before, and I think they've done because of my insistence in many areas of responsibility in which the committee was gracious enough to go along in order to make them an accomplished fact, and I think that is desirable. Now this is just a question, it's just as broad as it is long as far I'm, I can talk here for thirty minutes, but I'm not going to, I would like to have this body go on record by your vote, by your roll call vote; if your going to vote to adopt this amendment, even though it doesn't carry, then I think you have an intangible obligation to vote not to override the Governor if that happens. Now let's say this, let's say that we don't override the Governor, it's like it is now
