in the state so, in that...plus the fact that we get the matched federal funds for physical improvements in our own cities, for parks and recreation. For that reason, it is considerably different but it is a tax on hotel, motel. In that respect, it would be the same.

SENATOR SNYDER: All right. One other question. I think that the issue that Senator Stahmer is talking about is one that we need to take a good look at. It has merit, and I heard the question...maybe, it was in Josh, maybe it wan't, but could we, if we offered you enough support to bring the bill out, could we bracket the bill to where we can all get in contact again with the people who are interested in this where we have time to study, rather than try to take it right a way. Would you oblige the body and hold the bill for awhile on General File?

SENATOR STAHMER: I certainly would if this were the wish of the majority of the members. I would be willing to bracket it and if there is input on...for whatever input anyone wants to give, I would be happy to keep tab of what ideas people had.

SENATOR SNYDER: Mr. President, briefly then, I will support Senator Stahmer's move to bring this bill from Committee. I talked to many people in the business, out of the business. Nebraska, still, is not doing the job that many of us feel we can in this area. Talking about special taxes is a hard thing to do and, if it is not looked at very judiciously and is not nailed tight to the barn, you can get into a lot of problem areas, but I think this is one thing that we are going to have to look at and in all probability we are going to have to implement some degree of this, so I urge the body to consider what we are talking about and to give due consideration to the proposal that Senator Stahmer has brought forth and is asking us to bring to the floor now. Thank you.

CLERK: Senator Simpson voting aye.

SENATOR STAHMER: In view of the fact that there appears to be a lot of meetings going around, I think it would be judicious for me to ask for a Call of the House.

SPEAKER: A Call has been asked for. The clerk will clear the Board. At the next bell, the motion is to put the House under Call. In favor, vote aye. Opposed, vote nay. Have you all voted? The clerk will record.

CLERK: 21 ayes, 4 nays, to put the House under Call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: The House is under Call. The next bell, record your presence. I am present.

CLERK: Senator Simpson present.
