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people work and find jobs, when those who have all kinds of training and degrees cannot find jobs, when he himself could not find a job at which he could make a living. Games are being played again, now if Senator Schmit would substitute a motion saying bracket the bill for a week, I would go for that, but I would ask you to defeat Senator Snyder's motion to bracket the bill indefinitely until that monstrosity known as 404 should arrive on final reading, which I hope it does not do. It is an insulting measure, it's designed to generate a lot of emotion, something from which votes can be garnered in his particular district, but he knows that if there are not jobs available, you cannot say okay you'll find a job cause I tell you to get one. He ought to read some of the statistics from the labor department. The country is in one of the worse conditions it's ever been in since the depression, but that was a little before your time, you were a child at that time, and although you have grown, numerically in terms of years, perhaps certain of attitudes that you had when you were a child you maintain at this point, but we are men, and we are going to deal with these issues like men, and I would tell you that as men we should stand up and defeat what Senator Snyder is asking for.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Nore, the motion before us is to bracket 235 on final reading, that's the only subject under discussion.

SENATOR NORE: Mr. President, and fellow members. I would favor the bracketing of this bill, for several reasons. I think we are quite immature in our thinking, we are not looking into the philosophy of idleness, we know an idle family or idle nation never survives. Look back in history. As far as adversity is concerned that's what we need, that's what is good for us, that's what makes men out of us, is adversity. We've all had them, and I think most folks who are highly successful are those who have adversities, and those who are not successful probably have never had any. It's getting to the point where it is almost smart, and wise to probably have a dozen children, and do nothing and sit on your butts, let people bring it to you, and have people feel sorry for you. I would favor I think we are going at this thing wrong, I would be in favor of public works projects, like we had back in the 30's, CC Camps and etc., and put people to work, and try to get rid of this of the, I include the farmers on that too. I happen to get some subsidies from the Federal Government, you all know that, I know that Senator Syas is waiting for the point would bring that up, I'll bring it up for him. So, but we do do some work for this subsidy we get, and I think we are going at it absolutely backwards, and I agree with Senator Carpenter, we must provide jobs if we don't have jobs Senator Chambers, and public work jobs we have many parks, we have many to be improved, we have parks to be built, there is just so many things that needs to be done, but we can put people to work.

PRESIDENT: Senator Cavanaugh.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Mr. President and members of the body, I would offer an amendment to Senator Snyder's motion to bracket, until April 10th. I don't agree with Senator Snyder's reason here for bracketing, that we wait for his 404, he brought LB 404 into our committee and I was not terribly impressed at that time with Senator Snyder's vast knowledge of either our welfare system or the California welfare system. It did not appear to me that that bill was well thought out, or necessarily that he would have an opportunity in this session to completely prepare a bill, that even reasonably would achieve what he espouses to want to achieve, which is some vague form of welfare reform in the state of Nebraska. He went to California, and apparently was enamored with the, Governor Reagan, but I don't think there is any of us here that believes that our problem
