Thursday, but before I vote on this amendment, you are taking it now from a six thousand dollar bill to four hundred and some thousand.

SENATOR STULL: Six hundred and sixty-five down to four hundred and six thousand.

SENATOR MAHONEY: You are reducing it.

SENATOR STULL: Yes.

SENATOR MAHONEY: I didn't understand that at the beginning.

SENATOR STULL: Two hundred and forty-eight thousand dollars. It's reduced that much.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Fine. I...it will be all right for Thursday. We can discuss it at that time...I just was hoping that when we got the state aid bill, Senator Carpenter, was what I was more interested in. If I am going to vote for a state aid bill, this is a half a million dollars and I think the half a million dollars ought to go in to the total pot for state aid bill, regardless of whose bill it is. Yes, Senator Syas, this will be money that will be taken care of by state aid, eventually, in one of the plans it could be. I just wanted to...I don't want to prolong the discussion but it's a half million dollars, one way you look at it or another. You are just lopping off two hundred thousand.

PRESIDENT: Well.

SENATOR STULL: Are we in a position now...did I get unanimous consent to move it back?

PRESIDENT: Well, let's take up the unanimous consent to unbracket 43. Are there any objections to unbracketing LB 43. Any objections to unbracketing LB 43 on E & R Final. Hearing none. So ordered. Then, the bill is unbracketed. Now, Senator Stull.

CLERK: There is now a motion to return LB 43 to Select File for specific amendment.

PRESIDENT: All right. Senator Stull, back to you. Motion now to return it.

SENATOR STULL: OK. I move that it be returned to Select File for the amendment that is on the Clerk's desk.

PRESIDENT: All right. Now, we have that motion. Senator Syas, do you want to speak to the motion to return it to Select File for specific amendment
