SENATOR CHAMBERS: I think this might qualify as procedure if he will yield to a question.

PRESIDENT: All right. Let's try it. Senator Snyder, will you yield to a question?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Snyder, now I realize a lot of things occur during a year's time, so it may be difficult to recall this. So with the chair's indulgence I will try to refresh his memory so I can ask the question. There was to be a heavyweight championship title fight in Omaha, Nebraska and a certain piece of legislation had to be hurried through and there was not enough time to have a public hearing. Do you recall having a bill placed on General File without a public hearing?

SENATOR SNYDER: I recall an amendment to the bill, or yes, the bill, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank the Lord.

SENATOR SNYDER: We have brought that up several times and I have said since then, I said at the time that only in cases of dire emergency where the calendar is being raced against, et cetera. But when a bill is introduced when we are in the middle of a session, we have plenty of time to go through the normal procedures. I think we should go through the normal procedures.

PRESIDENT: All right. The motion is shall LB 548 be returned to Committee for a Public Hearing. All those in favor will vote aye. All those opposed will vote no. Motion is to return LB 548 to Committee for Public Hearing. 548 is...548 went to General File by suspension of the Rules and was placed directly on General File. The question is shall the bill be returned to Committee for a hearing. Have you all voted on the issue? Once again, have you all voted? The clerk will record.
