attempting to demonstrate that he is willing to work with the job and live with the problem. Now if we want to pick apart any appointment of the Governor, mine would be a good place to start and we could go right down the line. There is no one who is appointed by the Governor for any spot who if exposed to the detailed questioning and the lengthy criticism that Dr. Anderson has been exposed to wouldn't have a record that anybody could pick up and wave and say, these are the reasons that we shouldn't appoint this man. We're human beings and the person who is going to hold this job is going to be a human being. I don't think we have the right to ask for a super-human being to perform this job or any job. I think we have a duty to critically examine and, Lord knows we've done that. I think we have to accept the fact one way or another the Governor is going to find someone who agrees with his points of view and therefore it's a waste of our time to belabor that point. I can think of no one who has presented himself or is available who any one has suggested can do a better job. The argument seemed important to me that he shouldn't wear two hats and I'm satisfied now with a statement by Senator Whitney that that argument no longer exists. For the life of me and I, as I say, I have delayed as long as anyone in this chamber in making up my own mind, for the life of me I can see no reason at this time to fail to confirm Dr. Anderson and I will wholeheartedly suggest that we do it, we do it this afternoon and we let Dr. Anderson get on with the job of running that department.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Skarda.

SENATOR SKARDA: Mr. President, I move the previous question.

PRESIDENT: The previous question has been moved. Does the chair see five hands? Thank you. The question is, shall the debate now close? All those in favor will vote aye, all those opposed will vote no. You are voting on the previous question. Question is, shall the debate now close? Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 3 nays.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries to cease debate. Chair recognizes Senator Whitney for closing remarks on his motion regarding the confirmation of Dr. Anderson to the Director of Public Institutions. Senator Whitney.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I want to thank the Senator for that nice argument that he just gave. I think it was a very great speech in this Legislature. I want to be very brief in my remarks. At the public hearing, Dr. Anderson was asked the question as to why he wanted the directorship of the Department of Institutions and here is the quote. This is what he says: "it offers an opportunity for some professional coordination of three kinds of human behavior which need treatment or training--the mentally ill, the correctional programs and the mental retardation program. We use the same professional generally in affecting changes in attitudes and behavior and thinking patterns of these different kinds of people." Now the Committee on Committees has voted to check into the Motor Vehicle driving records of each and every person who came before the Committee and we looked over his Motor Vehicle driving record and he has a clean record--not a single moving violation which indicates to me something. There was some question as to his credit but he pays cash for his purchases and has only a debt on his home. The holder of the mortgage has written me a letter and says that Dr. Anderson is a personally and financially responsible individual. Now with reference to Dr. Anderson's
