PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: A point of personal privilege.

PRESIDENT: State your point, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I think the Governor has won and now I can finish my story. The wicked ruler and the 18 fawns lived happily ever after. Or maybe it's pawns.

PRESIDENT: What other business do we have before the body? Any other motions on the desk?

CLERK: None.

PRESIDENT: Are we ready for the consideration of bills on General File?

CLERK: Yes.

PRESIDENT: It is the chair's understanding we had two bills left over from yesterday.

CLERK: We have four bills left over really.

PRESIDENT: Well, very good. Stand by just a minute here until we find out where we are in the program. All right, we'll begin the afternoon's General File discussion with Senator Carpenter's LB 257. Senator Carpenter, your bill was temporarily laid over. Let's see if we can review where we are with the bill. Clerk give us some help there? 257.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Mr. President, I'm having amendments drafted by the proper people and they haven't got them done yet. I presume we will have them by tomorrow. I ask that we move over the bill, pass over the bill.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter asking unanimous consent to pass over 257. Are there any objections? Hearing none, so ordered. Move on to the General File consideration of LB 193.

CLERK: Reads title. The bill was first considered on March 19, it was again considered on March 20, it was again considered yesterday. There's a motion pending on it by Senator Kelly to indefinitely postpone the bill.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, members of the Body, it's my understanding that the introducer of 193 and 342 have gotten together and are making 193 through amendments that will be identical to 342. It is my understanding further that these amendments are to be put on by Senator Cavanaugh. Under these conditions, I request unanimous consent to withdraw my kill motion.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kelly is asking unanimous consent to withdraw his kill motion on LB 193. Are there objections to withdraw the motion? Hearing none, so ordered. The motion is withdrawn.
