SENATOR LEWIS: Senator Carpenter are we talking about all the facilities at Hiram Scott and I'm especially speaking to the dormitories and this type of facilities, does this include all of the facilities, related to this.

SENATOR CARPENTER: The bill for example at Hiram Scott is drawn in leaps and bounds, it's always been said they do not cover the dormitories at all, the dormitories now have some four million dollars in outstanding bonds against them. Neither I nor the people I attempt to represent want to acquire the dormitories in any form whatsoever, now or in the future. We don't expect this body to appropriate one quarter for that purpose.

SENATOR LEWIS: Thank you.

SPEAKER: Are you ready for the question? The Chair feels this is of enough importance to vote on the board. Now we are voting on the Carstens amendment to the Carpenter amendment. If you are in favor of the Carstens amendment you'll vote aye, if you are opposed vote no. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 2 ayes, 10 nays Mr. President.

SPEAKER: The Carstens amendment fails. Now Senator Carpenter back to your amendment.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I move we adopt the amendment in it's original form.

SPEAKER: The Clerk will read the amendment.

CLERK: Read.
