to put this, to get the notices out, and things of that nature to get these new Judicial Nominating Commissions which will take place in this fiscal year, there is not a dime of money to do it. So if we don't have the emergency clause on 110A, there won't be any way to finance this, we will have to wait, delay it until in the next fiscal year.

SPEAKER: Any further discussion, are you ready for the question? All those in, Senator Whitney were you asking for the floor?

SENATOR WHITNEY: Yes, this will read then, it is hereby appropriated \$13,373.00 from the state general fund for the period ending June 30, 1974, is that correct Senator Carstens? To the Supreme Court. You cross out July 1, 1973 too, those four words?

SENATOR CARSTENS: Well that's the way it should, strike as of July 1, 1973, too, and I don't have the bill here --

SENATOR WHITNEY: I see, I was just trying to clarify it to be certain that I knew what the amendment was.

SENATOR CARSTENS: I'm sorry I can't hear.

SENATOR WHITNEY: I was just trying to clarify what the amendment actually was, and hear you taking a period ending June 30th 1974, that is not very far away, so I just wondered if that was the amendment?

SENATOR CARSTENS: Yes.

SENATOR WHITNEY: So it is. Okay.

SPEAKER: Any further discussion, all those in favor of the amendments say aye, those opposed no, the amendments are adopted, now what will you do with the bill? Senator Carstens do you want to move that the bill be advanced?

SENATOR CARSTENS: I move the bill be advanced to E&R for initial.

SPEAKER: Senator Carstens, do you want to explain the bill?

SENATOR CARSTENS: 110A is the funding bill for 110, 110 is the bill which implements the constitutional amendment which sets out new Judicial Nominating Commissions which are the nominating commissions which appoint these, make the selections for appointments to the district and supreme court judges. 110A is the funding bill to put that into operation in the year 1973, now we have had a number of Judicial vacancies in 1973 and I understand we are going to have more and the Governor is anxious to get this bill going and so am I and so are the rest of us, because we'd like to get the Judiciary Nominating Commission in operation as soon as possible in accordance with the constitutional amendment adopted by the voters last fall. This is the purpose of the bill. I move the bill be advanced to E&R.

SPEAKER: Is there any discussion? Are you ready for the question, the question is shall the bill be advanced as amended, all those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. This requires 25 votes. The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, no nays, 24 not voting.

SPEAKER: The bill as amended is advanced.
