SENATOR CARPENTER: Senator, I can answer that specifically. The buildings that would be acceptable to what you have in mind and which are not in the taking of Hiram Scott, it is our hope and our belief and our desire that in the eleven county area that we have which is secure to itself that through that and through the availability of money, if it is available, we think that it will be and hope that it will be, then we will take a part of those structures for this specific purpose in order to create in western Nebraska a school for the mentally disturbed, the retarded children, alcoholics, and other things with a related nature. One of the reasons we are interested in that is because if this school is allocated and allowed, as I hope, then we can use these people as a part of an application to apply to people by student to get actual training on those who are affected. We think that this will happen. We are now, there is a bill, 302 and 311, which does both of those things in which the county and the local will put up 25% of what the state would put up
