SPEAKER: Okay. Now let's first of all dispose of Senator Carpenter's amendment to the committee amendment if we can.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I would suggest, Mr. President, that we adopt Senator Burbach's amendments and then print this amendment into the Journal and then we take this bill up next Monday.

SPEAKER: Any objection to that procedure? Senator Carpenter is suggesting that we act on the committee amendments, amendments first and then any other amendments to the committee amendments or, I presume, to the bill that are ready, be printed in the Journal and we take further action after acting on the committee amendments next Monday. Is there any objection to that procedure? Senator Stahmer?

SENATOR STAHMER: Mr. President, no objection but as I pointed out previous when Senator Burbach offered his amendment, I think if we're going to do this and I favor what Senator Carpenter said on taking this up next Monday, that efforts be made through either the fiscal staff of the, of the budget committee and/or through Mr. Peters to find out what the fiscal impact is and if its 3 or 7 million or 10 million, whatever it is, I think we should know and as nearly as we can know and have that be a part of the record when the discussion comes up next Monday and I, that doesn't say I would oppose it, but I think we ought to know one way or another when we're talking of amendments of this significance.

SPEAKER: Any objection to incorporating the fiscal impact in this? If not that's so ordered, now Senator Anderson's been asking for the floor for some time, then Senator Barnett.

SENATOR ANDERSON: Mr. President and Members of the Body. Are we going to discuss the amendment now or are we going to--(mike off)

SPEAKER: (mike off)--are prepared unless there is objection to discuss the committee amendments now.

SENATOR ANDERSON: Well, I, I wanted to address myself to the Carpenter amendment and support that, but if we're working on the committee amendments, I'll--

SPEAKER: Well, we will wait, unless there is objection to this, we will wait till Monday for that, during which time the, these amendments to the committee amendments will be printed in the Journal. Senator Barnett.

SENATOR BARNETT: Mr. Ques--Mr. President, a question of the Chair. I do have amendment here that I assume it's corrective from an inequity that was found in it as far as the veterans service is concerned and I wanted to know if I could amend that today or would you direct me then to wait until Monday to do the same?

SPEAKER: Well, I, I thought you would request that you do it Monday and have it printed in the Journal.

SENATOR BARNETT: I'll be happy to do that.

SPEAKER: Then everybody'll have a change to look at it. Alright. Senator Burbach.

SENATOR BURBACH: Could I move for the adoption of the committee amendments, please?

SPEAKER: Yes, and will you explain them?
