SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Mr. President, I move LB 207 as amended be advanced to E & R for engrossing.

PRESIDENT: You have heard the motion now to advance the bill, as amended. All those in favor of advancing the bill please say aye. Those opposed say no. The bill as amended is advanced.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Mr. President, I move the adoption of the E & R amendments to LB 290.

PRESIDENT: Motion is to adopt the amendments to LB 290. All those in favor of the motion say aye. Those opposed say no. Amendments are adopted. We have another amendment.

CLERK: Now, Mr. President, we have an amendment by Senator Carpenter to add the emergency clause.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Mr. President, it seems to me, I think this is an important bill and it may correct some of the things we are trying to contain. It's Senator DeCamp's bill on which people who are driving when they shouldn't be could lose their license for a period of time. If Senator DeCamp doesn't have any objection, I would like to have the emergency clause put on it.

PRESIDENT: Are there objections to adding the emergency clause? Well, the question is shall the emergency clause be adopted. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote no. Voting on the adoption of the "E" clause to LB 290. "E" clause to 290. 90. Senator Carpenter's motion is to add the emergency clause to LB 290. If you are in favor of it, vote, please. Thank you. The clerk will record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The emergency clause is adopted, then, to 290. Are there any other amendments to the bill? Very good. Senator Cavanaugh, back to you on 290.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Mr. President, I move LB 290 as amended be advanced to E & R for engrossing.

PRESIDENT: Motion, now, is to advance LB 290 as amended. All those in favor of advancing the bill, please say aye. Those opposed say no. So ordered. The bill as amended is advanced. Thank you.

CLERK: Mr. President, we have a unanimous consent request to print amendments to LB 414 in the Journal. Signed, Senator Stromer.

PRESIDENT: Are there objections to printing the amendments in the Journal. Hearing none. So ordered. We have 23 Kindergarten students and three adults from Kahoa School were visiting this morning. I am afraid they have gotten away from us. They are from Senator Barnett's district, that were here. We have 54 Sixth Grade students from Central School in Fairbury, Nebraska and their instructor is Mrs. Kathy Chapman and Meredith Milne. SENATOR CARPENTER: A matter of information to the body. The last time the Executive Council met a motion was adopted in order to acquire, not acquire, but to renovate land we now own into additional parking space, which will require the tearing
