is no reason why they should not continue to pay it under this system. Sections 9 and 10 again are clarifications which we have already taken up with regard to changes in sections dealing with necessary filings with the court. Section 12 adds three new sections, a new Section 29 exempts pro tem associate judges from the judiciary retirement system so that if you have a pro tem judge, that's a person that's just sitting in for a specific occasion, he is not an associate judge; therefore, he does not belong under the, the retirement system. That saves that cost. A new Section 30 gives the county judge power in chambers which is the same as the district judge has. A new Section 31 authorizes cities and villages to establish violations bureaus separate from the county courts to handle parking violations. We believed in 1932 they had this power; some attorneys have questioned it so to eliminate any doubt, we're putting it into this catch-up, catch-all bill. Section 13 is the new repeal section and takes out a number of obsolete sections. Those are the amendments to the bill.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of the committee amendments? Senator Cavanaugh?

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: I'd have one question of Senator Luedtke regarding the adoption, granting that authority to the associate judge--what

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Well, that, Senator Cavanaugh, that's in these areas where you know where adoption filings are made. Actually, we're up to, right now we have lawyers who question even an associate judge accepting.
